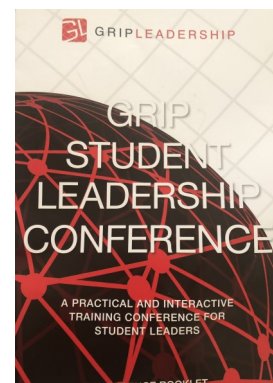

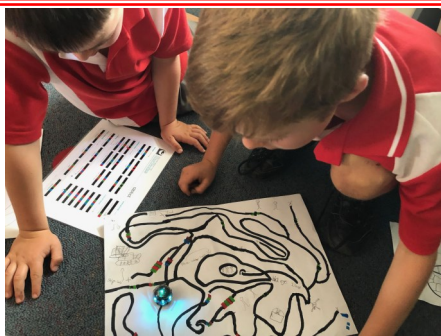
Kitchen Garden
